Guest Speaker

- Reagan High School Principal, Robert Pambello
 - Some statistics that were listed
 - Less than 4% dropout rate
 - 23% go to college
 - 300 students in computer magnet program
 - 200 ESL students
 - 20% of students are one grade behind in reading
 - approximately 30 student class size
 - 1700 student total

- Revovation and expansion project
 - They will be moving into completed parts of the building in June
 - There is 1.5 years left of construction and one-year on the old building
 - 2002 bond was to fund the expansion
- The school is split into five Academies that students choose in their freshman year.
 - Fine Arts
 - Business Technology
 - Health Science
 - Engineering and Architectural design
 - Computer Science
- Mike Webster, the Literacy Coach for Reagan spoke about strategies used with teachers to improve literacy in the classroom as well as community opportunities to volunteer to work with kids.
